

I works on the levee, Mama, both night and day.
I works so hard to keep the water away.
It's a mean old levee, cause me to weep and moan.
Gonna leave my baby, and my happy home.

The year is 1927, and Hobnob, Mississippi is drowning. It's been rain on rain for days, and the people of this modest town in corn country, population 3,244, are growing reckless, jobless, hopeless. The national headlines of the day reflect a dire state: "Seven more die in flood along the Mississippi...Additional levees broke today on both the Missouri and Illinois shores...Somebody's house passed through Memphis today en route to the Gulf of Mexico." Commerce Secretary, Herbert Hoover, in charge of flood relief for President Coolidge, has been courting the press and has his eyes firmly set on the White House. But, when the mysterious disappearance of two federal revenue agents in Hobnob threaten the momentum of Hoover's positive news cycle, he sends fellow agents and long-time partners Ted Ingersoll and Ham Johnson, on a mission to sniff out rumors of moonshining and foul play.

Set against the rich backdrop of Prohibition-era lawbreakers and one of the most harrowing, yet largely forgotten, natural disasters in American history, **THE TILTED WORLD (October 1, 2013; Hardcover; Fiction; ISBN: 9780062069184, Price: \$25.99; E-book ISBN: 9780062069207)** is a soulfully written tale of murder and moonshine, sandbagging and saboteurs, dynamite and deluge—and a man and a woman who find unexpected love—from *New York Times* bestselling author of *Crooked Letter, Crooked Letter,* Tom Franklin, and his wife, Pushcart Prize winning poet, Beth Ann Fennelly.

Dixie Clay Holliver is still reeling from the death of her infant son, taken by Scarlett fever. Dying a little each day, she cooks specialty whiskey through the nights to keep her hands and mind busy. Her husband, Jesse Holliver, is a charming snake of a man with two-toned eyes and a dual personality to match. Jesse is the face of the couple's bootlegging enterprise, trading bribes with high-powered rollers and spending time in whorehouses around town. Married too soon and under false pretenses, Dixie Clay's relationship with Jesse has long been a loveless one, focused on business rather than family.



When Ham and Ingersoll first ride into town, they come across a gruesome crime scene at the local general store which has been raided by looters. The store's clerk is lying bloody, dying on the floor, and the agents are greeted by the screams of a crying baby boy. Ingersoll, an orphan raised by nuns, refuses to leave the baby behind, or dump him at the nearest Greenville orphanage as Ham insists. Determined to find the baby a proper home, Ingersoll splits from Ham and sets off on a search that leads him to Dixie Clay. From the moment they meet, Ingersoll and Dixie Clay are drawn to each other, both yearning for the family life they never had, and enchanted by the baby boy before them. Dixie Clay quickly agrees to care for the child, but little does Ingersoll know that the young beauty is one half of the best shining team in town, and may be connected to the missing revenuers. A thrilling game of cat and mouse ensues as Ingersoll and Ham fold into Hobnob under the guise of levee engineers, and start to uncover unsavory secrets simmering beneath the rain.

Soon, a deadly new peril arises endangering them all. A saboteur, hired by rich New Orleans bankers eager to protect their city, is planning to dynamite the levee and flood Hobnob, where the river tilts precariously. Now, with time running out, Ingersoll, Ham and Dixie Clay must make desperate choices that will cause loyalties to be tested; choices that will radically transform their lives—if they survive.

A beautifully crafted work of historical fiction, **THE TILTED WORLD** is a haunting story of love and second chances, faith and family, and a deft drama that explores all the ways our history can define us.
